Rules for Any Sights Match

Overview

This event originally began in South Australia to encourage shooting competition amongst those shooters who found that they either:

- could not lay in the prone position for the duration of a full 60 shot match and/or
- that sighting with the peep sight (in accordance with the ISSF rules) was a problem because of visual difficulties.

It is also becoming popular amongst some other shooters as an alternative or additional competition.

The rifle

Any .22 calibre rimfire rifle weighing no more than 8kg as per ISSF rules.

The sights (any sight)

May be telescopic (no limit on power), peep sights, diopters eagle eye (lens in front sight), lens in rear sight, (these lens may have magnification).

Shooter apparel

Gloves, jackets, slings as per ISSF/TRA rules.

The target

The target is the ISSF 50 metres target.

The competition

The competition is a 60 shot competition from the prone position at 50 metres. It is shot in 3 x 20 shot strings, and sighting shots may be shot prior to the commencement of each 20 shot string.

The time limit for each 20 shot string plus any sighters is 30 minutes. Time calls are given at 10 minutes to go, 5 minutes to go and cease fire.

All other rules eg scoring, crossfires etc as for ISSF/TRA rules.
